



## **Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) Spending 2017/2018**

The pupil premium is extra funding which schools are given to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils.

### **Principles**

At Rodmarton Primary School we ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils. We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed.

All our work through the pupil premium will be aimed at moving children to, at least, age related expectations. Initially, this will be in English and maths. Ultimately, the use of the pupil premium funding will secure effective engagement from pupils to their school programme and, therefore, this may cover basic physical needs, educational and emotional support and extra-curricular activities.

In 2016/17, the total amount of funding received was £7920. The way that we spent the funding was to:

- Provide additional interventions with Teaching Assistants – both supporting groups in Literacy and Numeracy and on a one-to-one basis £4759
- To support pupil emotional wellbeing and raise their self-esteem through a weekly nurture group and family counselling £248
- Provide music lessons and contribute to the cost of school trips £479

### **Barriers to Educational Achievement**

- Inequality of opportunity within the pupil population.
- Low aspiration and expectations.
- Narrow experience of life outside school.

- Their attainment is at least in line with their peers and they meet their individual progress targets.

This will ensure that:

- PPG pupils are able to engage successfully in education, meet the required standards in line with National Expectations and their starting points

In particular, to support speech and language difficulties.	Funding support from TA's is a strategy that can be embedded across the school. Evidence shows that pupils make the most progress in a 1-1 intervention. The support aims to target a range of identified speech and language issues that hamper progress in reading, writing and mathematics for some of our pupils. We aim for all our children to become confident communicators, regardless of their starting points.	£4800
	Extra TA hours outside of Wave 1 work to deliver 1:1 and small group tuition, including a nurture group.	Some of the students need targeted support to catch up. Bespoke programmes led by skilled staff have shown to be effective in the school in previous years. Evidence from sources such as Visible Learning by John Hattie and the Sutton Trust-EEF Teaching and Learning Toolkit also support this view.
