GCC COVID-19 RISK ASSESSMENT PROCESS FOR SCHOOLS & EDUCATIONAL SETTINGS (supplementary guidance for primary schools inviting back additional pupils)



School employers are required to assess the risks associated with COVID-19 and implement preventative measures outlined in Government guidance. **The guidance has since been updated and new guidance was published on 15 June 2020 for primary schools that have capacity to invite more pupils in addition to the children of critical workers, vulnerable children and those in priority groups. Additional children should only return when the school can accommodate them while still following the approaches set out in the protective measures guidance and their own risk assessment. Therefore, SHE has provided this supplement to the GCC risk assessment to take this into account as well as other emerging risks. Where appropriate, schools must review their existing risk assessment and procedures and implement necessary changes.**

Supplementary COVID-19 Risk Assessment for Primary Schools Inviting Back Additional Pupils

Decide appropriate control measures for managers and employees to implement under a 'Plan', 'Do', 'Review' cycle.

*The protective measures in this risk assessment are not mandatory but are provided as guidance on reducing the risk of transmission. Each school/setting must consider their own situation and adapt the assessment by editing the measures where appropriate. Remove any measures that are not relevant or will not be applied in your setting and add any additional local measures that you are implementing.

Who may be at risk: Employees, pupils and young people, families (parents, carers and siblings), visitors, contractors, members of public.

Vulnerable groups – this risk assessment considers vulnerable groups which the NHS lists as 'people at high risk (clinically extremely vulnerable)'; and 'people at moderate risk (clinically vulnerable)' and BAME. An individual risk assessment may be appropriate for vulnerable employees and those who are very anxious about returning to their workplace.

The protective measures below supplement the GCC COVID-19 Risk Assessments for Educational Settings for primary schools that have capacity and are inviting back groups of pupils in addition to children of keyworkers, vulnerable children and priority groups (reception, year 1 or 6). The protective measures in existing risk assessments remain valid and should continue to be implemented for all groups. A check of the risk assessment to make sure the precautions remain suitable and to add any additional measures you will be taking is all that is required.

If staff teach more than one group, the number of groups they have contact with will be minimised. Teaching more than one group will not be on the same day. Where possible there will be a minimum gap of 48 hours between staff teaching different groups. Staff teaching multiple groups will keep a safe distance from children, particularly close face to face support. Year 6 pupils that have attended a secondary school for transition will be instructed and monitored to keep to social distancing rules. 	<p>This will include all contacts of the confirmed case in the 48 hours prior to symptom onset (the infectious period).
