Oak Class: James for rising to the Challenge in his assessments and being a super star at going back and checking his answers.

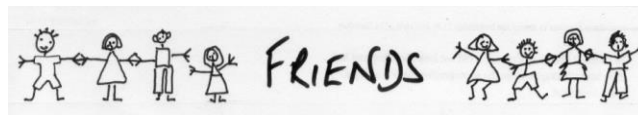

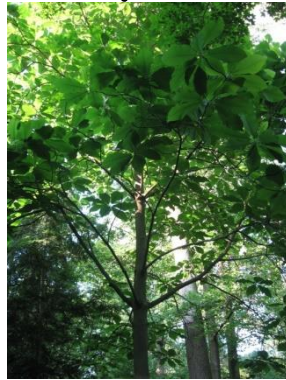
